

# **DEVELOPING RED MAPLE BONSAI**

#### I've had a lot of fun working with red

**maples**, also known as swamp maples, over the past few years. The basic training routine is the same as it is for other deciduous species – prune and reduce foliage in the middle of the growing season and then prune again fall. Depending on how vigorously the tree

grows, you can repeat the spring work several times during the growing season. In spring, after the first flush of growth hardened off, I pruned and partially defoliated the tree to prevent the interior branches from becoming weak. After partial defoliation






I removed large leaves during the remainder of the growing season and shortened some long shoots but otherwise let the tree grow until fall. Once most of the leaves had turned color, I removed

the leaves by hand, when they came off easily, and with scissors, when they were stubborn.





# **RED MAPLE BONSAI**

Athough I've only been working on this specimen for four years; the change has been dramatic. I don't know where I'll end up with this tree, but I'm really enjoying the process.
