MESSAGE FROM THE L.I.B.S. PRESIDENT

Congratulations to board member Jason for winning "Finest Individual Shohin" at the 2025 US National Bonsai Exhibition in Rochester. I hope this inspires all members to consider displaying their bonsai whenever opportunities arise. This year LIBS has provided opportunities for display at Planting Fields Arbor Day Festival, Humes Japanese Stroll Garden and as a Tokanoma at our regular meetings. None of these opportunities were judged competitions, so that members would not feel intimidated.

One approach to improving your trees would be "Critique" by a knowledgeable bonsai person. "Critique" should not be feared, but rather considered as sincere positive advise. A tree may have several design options you may not have considered. Another set of eyes can provide another perspective. Which design chosen is ultimately your choice. Once a design goal is established, the process becomes a "development/training" process. Each growing season will get you closer to your vision for the tree. Bonsai may be appreciated at any stage of development and worthy of display. We all understand this is a dynamic process with no final end-point. Hal Johnson, President, LIBS

At Our Last Meeting:

SEPTEMBER'S EASTERN WHITE CEDAR DEMONSTRATION

The September 8th meeting featured bonsai artist, Kris Springer. Known for his work on American Larches, which prefer colder zones. Kris cautioned us that Japanese Larches are more workable in our zone but may not be much longer given northern migration of zones. One of his other preferred species suitable for our zone is Eastern White Cedar (Thuja occidentalis). It is a resilient mountain species that is very forgiving. They can tolerate full sun, variable watering conditions, tolerate aggressive pruning (up to 70%) and bud back well. The challenge will be to aggressively prune to keep it compact until it is root bound in the pot. Always start at the top, shorten frods between the scales to allow bud back, increase ramification and remove cones immediately. Cut back "water sprouts" (frods that grow faster then the rest) leaving a minimum of two shoots and it will bud back. He discussed details on fertilizing, soil and use of insecticidal soap.

Wiring can allow 360 degree twists, but be aware that there is a top and bottom surface of the frods that should be maintained. Long branches may be shortened with serpentine bends in different axial directions. He disclosed his technique of how to radically bend Jins (Deadwood) in a new direction by a detailed steaming method. Kris allowed everyone to get close for the actual work on the tree. Kris brought some Black Pines and the large White Cedar.

A new member, Rei won the tree.
