At our Saturday January meeting, Vin Russo styled one of two Pitch Pines. Attendees choose the one he styled. Original tree is directly below. The finished tree is pictured to the right directly below with Vin and its new owner, Michael Ulrich. It was decided that it would be a cascade style, since it already had that shape. Cascade style comes from natural trees up on mountains pulled down by altitude and snow.

Vin started needle plucking, followed by wiring and then the most technically part styling.

To create denser foliage, in early summer and fall, break off the candles. This will create smaller needles and cause the needle to branch more. Please notice that Vin left the pine cones on the tree. We LOVE that!!!!!!!
