2024 98th Kokufu Bonsai Exhibition

The 2024 98th Kokufu Bonsai Exhibition is being held in two parts this year (Part 1 February 9-12, 2024 and Part 2 February 14-17, 2024.) Again, (like most years) held the exhibition in the Tokyo Metropolitan Art Museum in Ueno Park, Tokyo, Japan.

These are my personal thoughts; coming from a serious 62 year intense bonsai study. As a bonsai scholar I have probably attended more Kokufu Bonsai Exhibitions than any other foreigner. Although I was not present (or even born yet) at the first exhibition held in 1934, I have visited when the original museum was the venue. It was a grand building with lots of front steps outdoors. There were then two curved stair cases leading down to the ground floor where all the bonsai were displayed in one huge open room with a transparent roof which was great for allowing natural light which is desirable, for maintaining both evergreen and deciduous trees indoors for about a week. Trees

must be kept at appropriate temperatures and humidity levels when displayed for health reasons. During the early days of this long-held exhibition, the shows were held both in March and November. Originally founded by Count Matsudaira and Toshio Kobayashi, this exhibition was organized and held by the Tokyo Bonsai Club, which subsequently evolved to the present Nippon Bonsai Association in 1963.
